Bonnie Borshay Sneed (Waco, Texas) has been a collegiate choir director for over twenty years and has taught high school in Oklahoma, Texas and Florida. She conducted twice in Carnegie Hall, and sang there under the direction of Robert Shaw. Dr. Sneed has conducted major choral/orchestral works with her own orchestra, and has been an invited conductor to perform with the Oregon Bach Festival Choir and Orchestra and twice with the Varna (Bulgaria) International Conductor's Workshop. Her American choirs have toured overseas and sung at NAFME and ACDA conferences. Sneed has been a clinician for Honor Choirs and Workshops in several states, as well as serving as an adjudicator and presenter for national organizations in the area of scholarship and conducting. She has published editions with Hal Leonard, Earthsongs, Colla Voce and National Music. Sneed earned the BME from Furman, the MM from Southern Methodist, and the DMA from Michigan State. She has been Secretary for the National Collegiate Choral Organization, and SWACDA R&S Chair for Colleges and Universities. She currently is the conductor of the MCC Chorale in Waco, Texas.
